



Emergent language lessons build interest in books and engage the learner.





In emergent lessons, the child is not asked to read the book.



Story boards are an aid for the child to answer questions or comment on the characters and action.

Individual words may be singled out or letters located, however, those sub lessons, while directly relating to the text, do not require the child to read.



The lessons center around the child understanding the story.

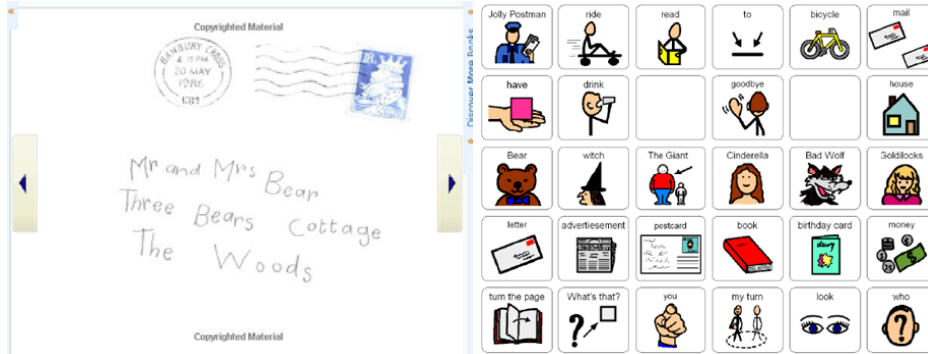
The book illustrations or graphics on a story board are a support for the concepts of the story.



They are more important than the text, because their use accomplishes the goal of these lessons-- participation in an emergent language activity.



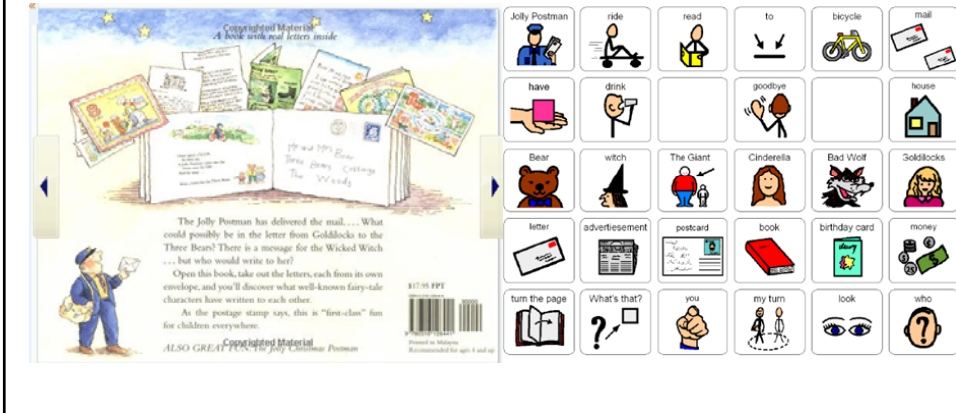
Discussion about the illustrations within the book set the stage for the language contained on the pages



Communication boards allow the student to easily reenact the events of the story.

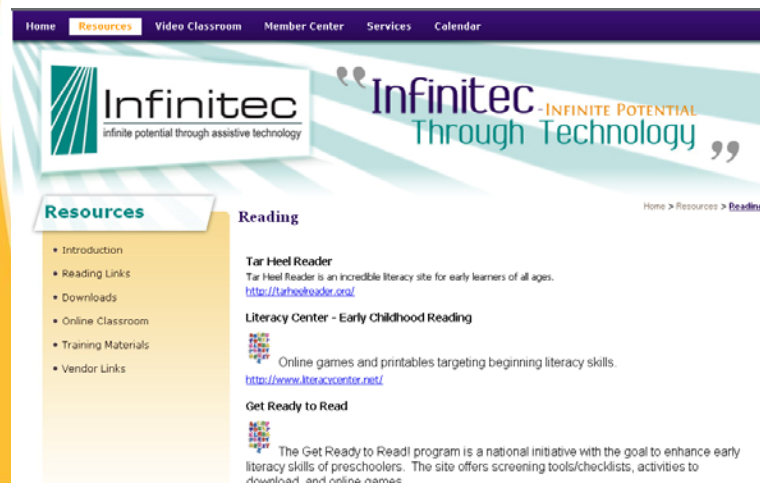


Message switches provide repeating lines or lines of a poem so children can participate in the reading and/or retelling of the book.
